Shoulder to Shoulder Scholarship Program Update

Dear Scholarship Program Sponsor:

I want to take this opportunity to provide an update about the Shoulder to Shoulder (STS) Scholarship Program in Honduras and to thank you for your past participation in this important program. This educational program has been in existence for many years, as we serve students throughout the area of Intibucá, where our clinics and healthcare sites are located.



We are very pleased to inform you that several of our scholarship students will be celebrating their graduation this month as the Honduran school year is coming to an end. Thanks to your generous support, we were able to sponsor 106 students this year of which 14 will be graduating in November. They will be receiving a three-year degree (equivalent to a HS diploma in the U.S.) in areas such as: computers, community development, nursing, teaching and small business development. This will enable them to apply for salaried jobs and eventually help themselves, their families and community. Without Shoulder to Shoulder's commitment and your generosity, these students would never have had a chance to pursue their dream of continuing their education beyond sixth grade.

We have so much to celebrate this year. Besides celebrating graduations in

the communities of Camasca, Concepcion, Magdalena and Santa Lucia, we also are very proud of our three students attending the university in Tegucigalpa. Marleny is finishing her third of a five-year program in nursing; Jose is in his second year of nursing. Mirna is in her second year of a four-year program in business administration. These three students were carefully selected and given the rare opportunity to continue with their education at the university level. They come from very poor families and without such generous support from a sponsor in the U.S., they would be stuck in the cycle of poverty.

This past summer, my family and I spent three weeks in Honduras, mainly in the areas that STS serves. Our lives were once again touched by the conditions and lack of basic needs people face on a daily basis. Due to safety concerns in the country, international aid has been reduced or gone away entirely as have other sources of income such as manufacturing and tourism. The unemployment rate is very high, and the possibility of obtaining a job almost becomes a dream for many. The opportunities for young people, especially in this rural, once very isolated area, are so limited. Various parents, teachers, mayors and local community leaders asked

me about the scholarship program. They are very concerned that so many students aren't able to continue their school beyond sixth grade. Without furthering their education, so many will be forced into "survival mode," trying to earn a menial living as housekeepers or field workers.

As my children played soccer in the town square, I saw much love and care from the local children toward each other and mine. The children didn't mind sharing the only small bag of water (you can buy it in bags) they had. There is so much sense of community, people wouldn't mind sharing with us the last bit of food they had saved for their next meal.

When we returned back to the U.S., it was time for back to school shopping. We made several trips to the local stores tying to find the perfect color or design of school supplies, a nice backpack, stylish clothes and shoes, etc.



I was quickly reminded that in some parts of Honduras, children don't have these options. They can only afford one pencil or pen at a time. Paper is purchased as individual sheets, markers, glue and colored pencils are a luxury items; kids may have to wait until mom sells her chicken or eggs in order to buy even basic school supplies.

As you know, a program without funding cannot continue, and as we look ahead for the 2016 school year, our financial position is not strong. Many students will be at risk of losing scholarships as a result. We need you, our committed donors, to come through. We are grateful for your faithful

support. We hope for a very positive response so we can bring cheer and hope to our students as we let them know that they can continue in the program next year.

We have also included some testimonials from current students in the program, which demonstrate the impact it has on their lives.
