

Shoulder to Shoulder SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM UPDATE

January 2021

The concepts of "remote learning" and "work from home" changed everyone's lives last year, and it was no different in Honduras from an education standpoint. When the world seemingly shut down last March, all schools and universities in Honduras went to a version of virtual learning wherever possible. As you can imagine, it was more difficult to achieve in the rural, poorer areas of the country. However, teachers and students adapted to the best of their abilities and resources available.

OUR IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS

Since 2010, we have sponsored over

1,600

students in five of the most remote communities of Honduras. Despite all the challenges of the pandemic and major hurricanes in 2020, the STS scholarship program still had another very successful year. Thanks to your generous donations, **138 scholarship students were able to stay on track and finish the school year,** which ended in November. Nineteen students graduated from their "colegios" (equivalent of high school), which is a huge accomplishment.

So how did STS do this? Fortunately, we were able to provide computer tablets to most of our scholarship students. These tablets were uploaded with a digital version of textbooks and educational content. Students were then able to continue their studies at home even without access to the internet. The tablets were also uploaded with books, which are incredibly expensive in Honduras. Since are there are no public libraries, having books at their fingertips is a dream come true for these students.

For students without tablets, we quickly created a "pilot project" to purchase a limited internet package for students. Using cheap phones, students in remote areas could now access the internet for their studies. Teachers had to get creative as well. School supplies, supplied by STS, were personally delivered to students by teachers, sometimes via motorcycle rides over mountain trails.
