PROGRAM SUMMARIES:

Nutrition

"Hens Hatching Hope: Un Huevo Cada Dia" was started in 2021. We continue to work with Dr. Ana Palacios (formerly employed by Mathile Institute; now a professor at Georgia Southern University). 25 women are raising eggs in 25 communities. StS purchases their eggs, and provides them to 450 children between the ages of 6 months and 2 years of age; 200 children are in a control group, not receiving eggs.

Bilingual School:

The school is a public school, operated by the Honduran Dept of Education, from Kindergarten to 6_{th} grade. Unfortunately, the Dept of Education only provides 4 teachers for the school; StS and the Parents Association pay for 3 additional teachers.



Shoulder to Shoulder provides an annual budget of \$25,000 to support teaching and infrastructure at the school. Funding is provided by monthly Child Sponsorships.



This past year, 2024, has been a year of remarkable achievements for our students. Notable successes include a 95% improvement in Spanish and mathematics, first-place wins in local and national math olympiads, victories in reading contests, and obtaining a record of books read. Along with this, enhanced reading and writing skills, improved reading comprehension, increased student inclusion, reduced school dropouts, and heightened parental involvement in student homework, both at home and at the school.
